

The Bishop urged us to be Joyful, Trustful, Thoughtful and Kind people, to speak of God's word from wherever we are, and to continue to share generosity.

After each service we had the opportunity to talk to so many people, clergy and lay, and present and hopefully future members.

I was told of new members being enrolled all over the diocese – this is something I can't wait to share with Bishop Michael when I have a meeting him.

The Bishop asked me to thank you for your 'thoughtfulness and kindness'



Between the two services there was a Procession of Faith through Lichfield Town Centre — a wonderful sight to see, with about 200 people leaving The Cathedral Close and entering town. The Salvation Army Band led, children, clergy, lay readers, Canons, Archdeacons and visiting Bishops were followed by Bishop Michael, with our own Diocesan Chaplain Revd. Preb Carl Ramsay by his side [Carl was also the Dean of the Eucharist at the 3.30pm service]. Only a few yards behind Bishop Michael was the Mothers' Union Banner, which led the parade of the individual deanery banners from the Goodness of God Celebration last year.

Like the banners and the parade there was a great feeling of moving forward throughout the day – I'm so glad Mothers' Union is and will continue to be part of that moving forward for God.
